Note: The statistics reported here are from the archives at Tuskegee Institute. Lynching statistics prior to 1882 scarcely exist, and even those available after 1892, when Ida B. Wells began investigating lynching and Tuskegee Institute started collecting and tabulating data, are not necessarily accurate. Innumerable lynchings went unreported, many lynchings went unreported in newspapers, which were the sources of Wells's and Tuskegee's statistics, and there was no consistent definition of what constituted a lynching. After the NAACP began keeping lynching statistics in 1912, its numbers differed from Tuskegee's. Nevertheless, the patterns that emerged are starkly clear: More blacks than whites were lynched, lynchings occurred much more often in the South than elsewhere in the United States, and after peaking in 1892, the number of lynchings very slowly declined.
